Who's it for?

This apprenticeship is for learners who are taking responsibility for managing projects, project activities or workstreams. They will be responsible for planning project delivery, including scheduling activities, identifying risks and opportunities and developing and maintaining resource plans.

They will then monitor project delivery, using a project management plan to track budget, resource, schedule, quality and benefits throughout the life cycle of the project, responding appropriately to threats, opportunities and the need for change.

Through the duration of the apprenticeship, learners will need to have at least one project or workstream of their own to manage, which will be captured and reflected on through the project report, presentation and Q&A assessment method at EPA.


